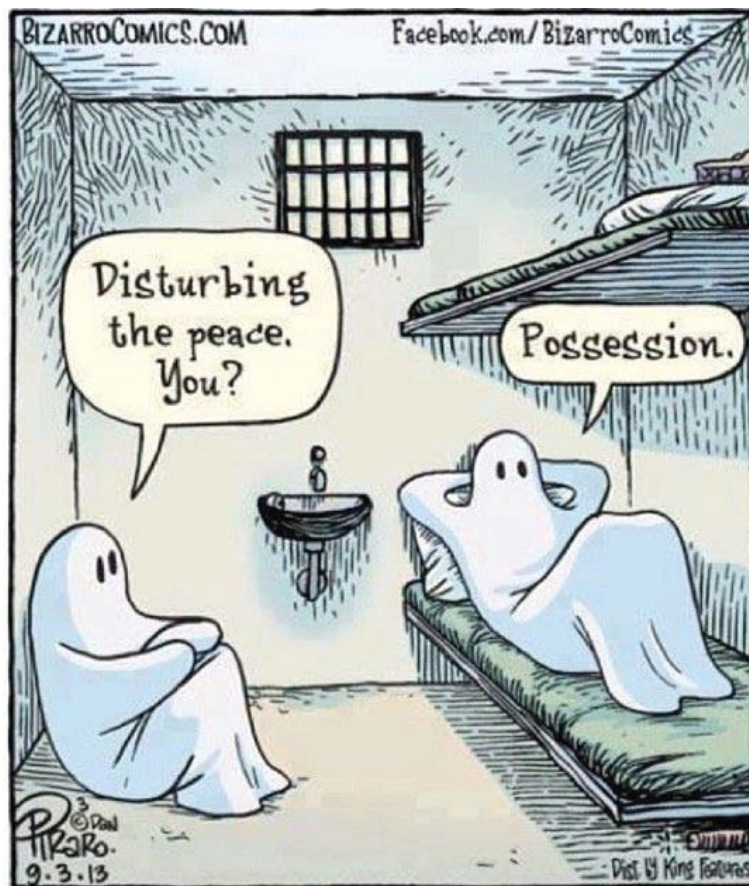
From The President

Kinsmen celebrate the 50th anniversary of Calypso '67

50 years ago the Kinsmen Clubs of Hespeler, Galt and Preston got together to celebrate Canada's centennial by organizing "something different". Calypso '67 was a major event, lasting 4 days at the end of August 1967. 80 Jamaicans were flown up to provide entertainment that attracted thousands. There were concerts, street fairs, dances, spot performances, and even drop-in shows for shut-ins. The down towns of Hespeler, Preston and Galt were trimmed with palm-trees and other Caribbean symbols. Merchants and companies of the three communities joined in the festivities. On the final day a huge parade drew an estimated 100,000 people to the three communities. There were 125 entries, 30 bands and a total of 3000 people in the parade, which lasted almost 3 hours. The parade started in Hespeler, was loaded on trucks to move to Preston , then on the trucks again to start in Galt. The parade was so long that it was still going in Hespeler when it started in Preston. That evening a free concert drew 15,000 to Dickson Park for the finale.

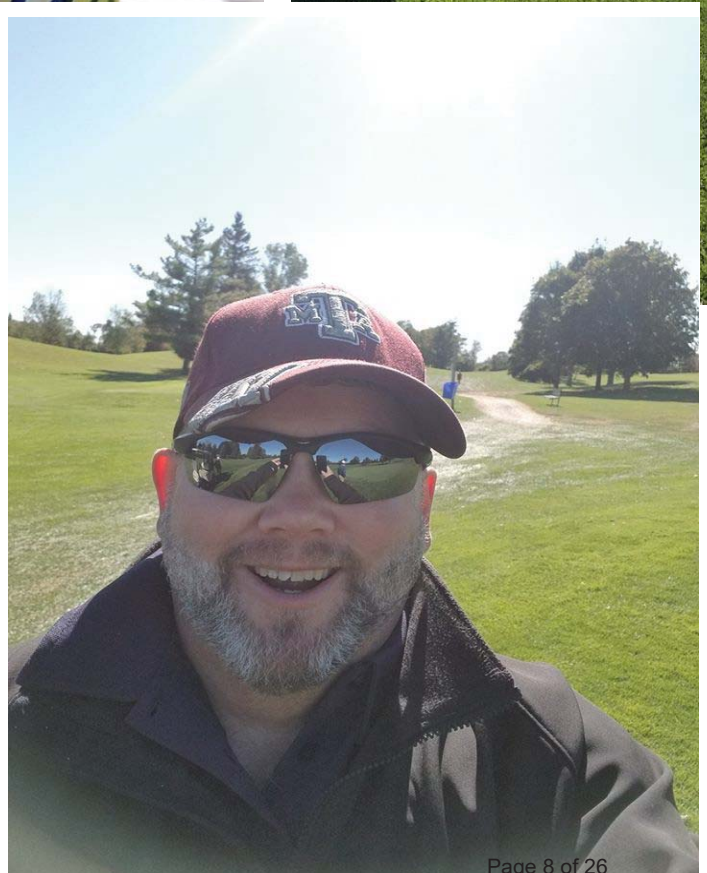
The Kinsmen clubs worked for 18 months to do the elaborate organization required. The event was widely applauded by the communities, with one newspaper headline saying "best ... in history". Later the Civic Service Club named the three Kinsmen clubs joint "Citizen of the Year".

Last Friday evening 40 area Kinsmen gathered to remember the effort and the success with photos and reminiscences. Key members of the original Calypso committee were present including chairman George Irving Jr. and PR Chair Sam Cameron.

Highlights from Kin Canada National Convention in Halifax

Kin Canada, the country's largest all-Canadian service organization, celebrated its 97th National Convention in Halifax from Aug. 17 to 19. More than 300 members

gathered for three days of fundraising, fellowship and finding new ways to carry forward their mission of serving the community's greatest need.

Outgoing national president James Doerr oversaw the events put together by the Kin Club of Halifax, kicking off the week with a flag raising in Grand Parade on Wednesday morning, Aug. 16, and concluding the weekend with the appointment of incoming national president, Terri MacCannell.

On Friday night at an annual celebration of club service, cheques were presented for the amount raised by Kin clubs over the past year.

In total, more than \$18 million was raised for communities across the country.

Halifax MP Andy Fillmore thanked clubs for their contributions while president of the MS Atlantic Division, Ben Davis, recognized the association for the \$3.1 million raised for the MS Atlantic Division over the past 40 years.

The Stampede City Kinsmen and Kinettes helmed an additional live fundraising initiative for the MS Society, where they were able to raise more than \$40,000 in less than seven hours. Dubbed Kin Catch and Release, the fundraiser had members put in "jail" (a large lobster pot constructed on site) to be bailed out by pledges via social media.

In recognition of the convention, the Westin hotel (where the convention was held) agreed to donate \$1,000 to charities of the local club's choice.

Money was donated to Hope Blooms, a grass roots youth food security initiative that 48 members visited on Friday, Aug. 18, as well as local organizations Peace by Chocolate and Dress for Success, who both addressed delegates during service awareness day.
